Subject: Report Rerun: Readmission, Mortality, and EDAC Measure Detail Reports

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Issues were identified related to missing data elements in the Readmission, Mortality, and Inpatient Quality Reporting (IQR) Excess Days in Acute Care (EDAC) measure details reports.

The Readmission issue was related to planned and unplanned readmission indicators, meaning patient-level reports may not have reflected the readmissions shown in summary results.

The Mortality issue was related to the risk factor percentages in the stroke and COPD measures, as well as missing stroke-only columns on the associated report CSV.

The EDAC issues were related to:

- Index summary stay patient count may not have matched between patient-level reports and the HQR interface
- "Days from index discharge to first event" possibly showing incorrect number of days
- "End date of event" and "day count for event" may have shown incorrect date and/or number of days
- Missing patient level data for index cases

The issues have been remediated, and all reports in these categories were rerun. Please note that these specific issues were isolated to reporting and the fixes have not resulted in changes to measure results or publicly reported measure details.
