We started jargon busting in our last Qualit-e-Quips and found more terms that could use some explanation: Facility Administrator and Security Administrator.

- Facility Administrator Used in the **National Healthcare Safety Network (NHSN)** to describe the person who has the authority to submit data and to add other users who can view and enter data into the NHSN.
- Security Administrator Used in the **QualityNet Secure Portal** to describe the person who has the authority to submit data and to add other users who can view and enter data reported to the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) through QualityNet.

Yes, they have similar functions. No, **they aren't interchangeable**. Facility Administrators are only allowed access to the NHSN, and there is a <u>special process</u> for becoming one. Security Administrators are only allowed access to QualityNet, and there is a <u>special process</u> for becoming one. If you're the Facility Administrator for NHSN, that doesn't mean you can access the Secure Portal of QualityNet; these are separate systems with separate security requirements.
