Question 3: For the new five measures, am I understanding correctly that we are not fiscally responsible until 2019? Or does that start prior to January 1, 2019? And I thought that transition record and Metabolic is for FY 2018 and SUB-3 and SUB- 3a is for FY 2019. Is that wrong and all are FY 2019?

Question 4: What is the difference between the new claims-based measure that CMS completes and the new chart abstracted measures?

The claims-based measures require no additional action by the facilities to collect the data. CMS obtains the data from claims. The new chart-abstracted measures require the facility to upload data to the *QualityNet Secure Portal*.

Question 5: Do you hear any buzz about adding e-cigarettes to the FY 2018 tobacco measures?

We are not aware of consideration of adding E-cigarettes to the Tobacco measures developed by The Joint Commission.

Question 6: Why don't the transition measures or the screening for metabolic disorders measure have short ID's. Will they someday?

We will discuss your request with the measure developers and CMS.

Question 7: If these tools are optional, why is there some information on the tools that is not in the specifications manual?

The paper tools may provide additional information useful for the abstraction of the data.

Question 8: Can you confirm that for FY 2018 measures, FUH is a claims based measure?

As this is a claims-based measure there is no action required by facilities to collect and submit data for this measure. CMS will calculate the measure outcome using Part A and Part B claims data that are received by Medicare for payment purposes. CMS will calculate this measure by linking Medicare fee-for-service (FFS) claims submitted by IPFs and subsequent outpatient providers for Medicare FFS IPF discharges. This approach requires no additional data collection or reporting by IPFs. Completion of this measure does not affect an IPF's payment determination.

Question 9: Can't a facility elect not to participate and lose 2% of APU what are the other consequences...who can one contact regarding this?

Because this is a pay-for-reporting program, eligible facilities will be subject to payment reduction for non-participation. Eligible IPFs that do not participate in the IPFQR Program in a fiscal year or do not meet all of the reporting requirements will receive a 2.0 percentage point reduction of their annual update to their standard federal rate for that year. The reduction is non-cumulative across payment years.

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Question 14: **We register and completed the participation in 2016. Our provider number starts 7/1/16, when do we start reporting. We have been keeping up with data collections.**

New facilities must complete the Notice of Participation (NOP) no more than 180 days from the Medicare Accept Date. All IPFs that are eligible to receive full APU for a given fiscal year must have an IPFQR Program NOP status of “Participating” by the annual August deadline (which is typically August 15). Specifically, IPFs must ensure that the NOP status is “Participating” by August 15, 2017, in order to meet the NOP requirement for the FY 2018 payment determination. Once an IPF has submitted a NOP status of “Participating”, the IPF is considered an active IPFQR Program participant and is subject to the IPFQR Program requirements in order to obtain full APU. The NOP stays in effect until the IPF submits a withdrawal of participation or until there is a change in the eligibility status of the IPF.
